Illicit Discharge

What is illicit discharge?

the disposal or discharge of pollutants and non-storm water materials into a storm sewer system via surface flow, direct dumping into the storm sewer or water body, or through illegal connections to the county storm sewer system.



Violations:

- < Sewage
- × Oil/fuel
- × Pet waste
- Yard waste
- × Garbage
- × Fertilizers
- × Pesticides
- Soap/cleaners
- × Dumpster leakage
- × Paint
- Septic tank effluent
- Pool chemicals or pool discharge that is not dechlorinated

Allowable:

- ✓ Firefighting activities
- ✓ Water line flushing
- ✓ Landscape and irrigation water
- Potable groundwater sources
- ✓ Foundation footing drains
- ✓ Air conditioning condensation
- ✓ Individual car washing
- De-chlorinated swimming pool water
- ✓ Street wash water
- Any discharge not containing pollutants
